It checks grammar proficiency on the basis of seven dimensions: 1) Synonyms; 2) Spellings; 3) Nouns and Pronouns; 4) Prepositions; 5) Conjunctions; 6) Verbs; 7) Structure and Knowledge.

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Grammar Competence refers to a set of theoretical knowledge (rules) and language skills that are necessary and sufficient for students to construct correct sentences, to understand them, to monitor grammatical errors, to pass judgments about right and wrong linguistic forms, and to perform language testing tasks. In other words, it is the extent of proficiency in English Grammar retained by the students, focusing on the components such as syntax, vocabulary, phonetics, and morphology, which facilitate the usage of language and procedures of various language skills viz. Listening, Speaking, Reading, and Writing.

Total Score Interpretation

Overall_Lower Grammar Competence

The respondent's score corresponds to low competence in grammar. This entails that they've scored low on the following dimensions of grammar competence: synonyms, spellings, nouns, prepositions, conjunctions, verbs, and word structure and knowledge. They lack skills that are necessary and sufficient to facilitate the usage of language and procedures of various language skills viz. Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing. Their proficiency in English Grammar, primarily focused on its components such as syntax, vocabulary, phonetics and morphology, is poor. They require prompt intervention via rudimentary level courses for increasing proficiency in English language grammar or comprehension.
